- The weather can change so bring a waterproof, and it can be cooler on the tops, so wear warm clothing.
- We regret that dogs are NOT permitted on the walk, with the exception of guide and hearing dogs.

The South Pennines watershed landscape is the upland habitat where rainwater is divided east from west; North Sea from Irish Sea, and Yorkshire from Lancashire.

The Watershed Landscape project, funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund and managed by Pennine Prospects will support landscape restoration, access and heritage projects in the area.
