*Workshop 1: Interpreting your heritage: How to tell the stories about sites, people and places from the past and present*

Ever wanted to produce a panel, leaflet or guided walk about the heritage of a special site, person or place? This practical workshop will introduce the principles of interpretation and highlight examples of best practice. Find out how to present your heritage stories and communicate them in a way that is appropriate for your heritage and your audience.

*Workshop 2: Rough Guide to Social Media*

This session will take you through the basics of setting up Facebook and Twitter and how to exploit them to advertise your society, group, or events.

*Workshop 3: Discovering Prehistoric Rock Art*

Prehistoric carvings are a unique and valuable part of our heritage, providing a direct link with the people who lived here over 5,000 years ago. It is important to try and capture a detailed record of the carved stones and their surrounding landscape both for current studies and to guide conservation management, so we can protect them for future generations. See how the *CSI: Rombalds Moor* team have been achieving this with an interactive session on identifying and recording cup-and-ring carvings.

*Workshop 4: Landscape Surveying Using Handheld GPS Receivers*

When the Swaledale and Arkengarthdale Archaeology Group (SWAAG) was formed one of the key requirements was to perform accurate landscape surveys that could be mapped to a sufficient standard for publication in archaeological reports and journals. Stephen Eastmead introduces the methodologies SWAAG developed, which can be used by individuals or groups to record and publish their data without the need for expensive equipment or software.
